ASH WEDNESDAY: THE FIRST DAY OF LENT Wednesday, 22 February: High Mass with Imposition of Ashes at 12.15 p.m. (There will be no public Morning Prayer or early Mass.) Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament until 4.45 p.m., followed by Solemn Evening Prayer and Benediction.

Mass of the Chrism will be celebrated by The Principal on Monday in Holy Week, 2 April, at 11.00 a.m.

MASS will be celebrated on Sunday, 18 March at 11.00 a.m., and from Monday 19 – Friday 23 March at Noon. The House, Chapel and Library will close after Mass on Friday, 23 March. Trinity Term begins with Morning Prayer at 7.40 a.m. and Mass at 8.00 a.m. on Monday, 16 April. The first High Mass of Trinity Term will be on Sunday, 22 April, when the Preacher will be Father Barry Orford.

PUSEY HOUSE. During the 19th century Oxford was the centre of a revival of Church life which affected the whole of the Church of England, and had its influence far beyond. Dr E. B. Pusey, who for more than fifty years was Regius Professor of Hebrew and a Canon of Christ Church, was at the very heart of this Catholic Revival which became known as the Oxford Movement. In 1884 Pusey House was founded in memory of him as a centre of prayer, theological study and pastoral care, open to all members of the University. The House has always been known for its lively presentation of the Catholic Faith as received by the Church of England, and has a tradition of excellence in worship and strong doctrinal preaching. It is intended to complement the work of College Chapels, and seeks to feed into the Christian community in the University such insight about the Word and Sacraments as its tradition may be able to contribute.

The Principal and Librarians are always available and are glad to see any who call on them.

The *Friends of Pusey House* provide additional support for its work.

THE LIBRARY, which contains sections on Church History and Philosophy as well as on Theology, is open to all members of the University. Those wishing to use it should apply to Fr Orford (*the Custodian*).

THE CLERGY are pleased to give instruction in the Christian Faith, to prepare members of the University for Holy Baptism, Confirmation and the other sacraments and are available in the Chapel to hear Confessions at the following times:
