




The officiant begins in a low voice



The officiant continues in a higher voice



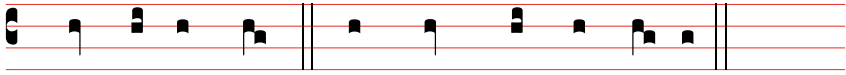


Old Testament Lesson
