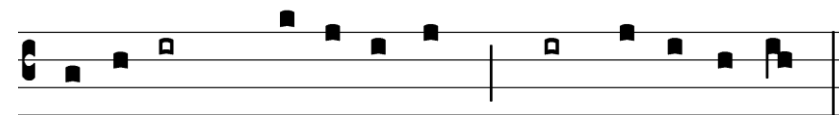

yea, let *all* the peo-ple praise thee.

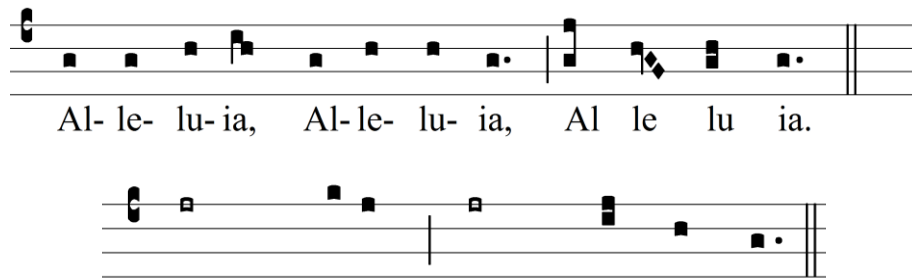

Recollection Series, 2.00-3.30 pm Wednesday 28 January. *St Maximus the Confessor in Context*, Dr Philip Booth.

Confirmations at Pusey House 24 May. Are you baptised but not confirmed? The rite of confirmation has two elements. The bishop lays hands on the baptised person and prays that he or she may be strengthened with the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit. Before that happens, candidates recite the vows which are made at baptism. Confirmation is a public profession of baptismal faith and a strengthening by the anointing of the Holy Spirit. The Bishop of Ebbsfleet will conduct a confirmation at High Mass on the Day of Pentecost at Pusey. If you are interested in being confirmed, please contact the Chaplain or Principal. Christianity 1.0- basics of the Faith according to Dr Pusey. Monday 6.00 pm to 7.00 pm, Pusey on Holy Communion - the Real Presence? After preaching a sermon on 'The Holy Communion as a comfort to the Penitent' in 1843, Pusey was banned from preaching at the University of Oxford for two years. His first sermon after the ban was essentially a more robustly defended and careful re-presentation of the same ideas. While his ideas were controversial at the time, his arguments seem more irenic and moderate today, because he made them on the basis of the Bible, the Church Fathers and Anglican Divines, and the formularies of the Church of England. Please come along with any questions you may have about Communion and how it is celebrated here at Pusey House.
